Late 2000/2001	Ontario's <b>Postsecondary Education Choice and Excellence Act passes</b> in late 2000, and comes into effect in 2001, allowing Sheridan and other provincial community colleges to offer baccalaureate degrees in applied areas of study
Late 2002/Early 2003	Sheridan is re-designated as an <b>Institute of Technology and Advanced Learning (ITAL)</b> , granting us the authority to offer an expanded number of applied degrees, up to 15% of our overall programs

September 2008	Sheridan launches <b>the new degree</b> : - Bachelor of Applied Health Sciences (Exercise Science and Health Promotion)*  *In June 2015, this program was renamed and its new title is <u>Bachelor of Health Sciences</u> (Kinesiology and Health Promotion)
May 25, 2009	The federal and provincial governments announce the Knowledge Infrastructure Program (KIP) approval to support infrastructure enhancement at Canadian postsecondary institutions and this includes funding to assist in building a new Sheridan campus in Mississauga
